Grade 1

Grade 3

Mr Muleya has continued to be a ball of energy throughout term 3. He has been learning much about the primary curriculum and his awareness of phonics has greatly improved. The pupils have loved having him as their teacher as he makes lessons fun and helps each pupil to improve academically. There are children in his class who often felt they couldn't achieve in lessons and Mr Muleya has worked with them individually, breaking down problems into manageable pieces. He has been delighted to see the pupils realise they have been able to achieve in Maths, English, Science, Social Studies or The Arts.

Grade 4

This class have had a tough term – preparing for upper primary. There has been a lot more writing and abstract words and concepts to try to understand. They have done a fabulous job! Handwriting and the amount of work the pupils produce independently have both improved this term. Miss Kangoma has continued to support pupils who clearly struggle with academic work and they have been regularly attending school and striving to improve. All the pupils have become more responsible and can often be seen tidying books, sweeping the classroom or choosing to practice their reading when they have finished their work or at break time.

Mrs Mwinga loves her pupils and as a result her pupils love her and love school. Whenever you walk into the Grade 5 classroom you find everyone hard at work. All the pupils know they have learned a lot and come through some challenging lessons this year. They are so excited to be Grade 6 next year and proudly tell us when they have been able to answer or explain something that an older pupil struggled with.

The class has highly anticipated being Grade 7 although they are not looking forward to leaving Kapumpe after their final year here.

Building Project 2019

Having completed block 3 at the beginning of the year, we were not sure if we would have another building project this year. Without a doubt, God has provided for us and we feel greatly blessed. Six weeks before the end of the year we began construction of our new ablution block as our current one is too small for the number of pupils and staff we now have. This block also includes 2 showers and should be completed in time for the new academic year. These builders have also built a strong room in the head teacher's office ready for storing exam papers. With this in place, the District Education Board should be able to grant us exam centre status.
