THE LONG AWAITED NSOBE TRIP

We have had a brilliant term 3 with activities happening nearly every day at the Arise building. More of our secondary pupils have been coming to use the study space on a Monday and Friday and those that have come regularly have seen an improvement in their grades.

In the past we had taken our Grade 10's for a discipleship day at Nsobe, a nearby game park. Due to covid restrictions in the past years we had not been able to go so this year we took our Grade 10, 11 and 12 pupils. They LOVED it! We had a scavenger hunt, Bible study, games, dancing, food and saw a number of animals including zebra and many types of antelope. The young people were very grateful for the experience and discussions.

BASKET MAKING

One of the ways we empower our guardians is to help them learn a skill that they can use to make money so that they are able to buy home essentials themselves. The mat making continues to be a success with guardians coming weekly to collect material or bring mats that are ready for sale.

We discovered this year that one of our guardians, Janet, knew how to make mats from plastic ties used for transporting large bales of goods. We asked her to teach other how to do this so that more guardians could have this skill and something to sell as well as something to do when the heavy rains are pouring for many hours. She was delighted to be able to share her knowledge and help others. Weaving is now part of the Tuesday Arise meeting.

ARISE YOUTH

The commitment from our senior pupils has continued to improve this term. We have seen at least 1 secondary pupil coming to study every Monday and Friday throughout the term. The pupils that have come have really grown in confidence and their friends have seen how they have improved academically. Now that the pupils are seeing the benefit of extra study first hand, I am sure that we will see even more young people coming for personal study each week in 2023.

Both days were a big success with the secondary pupils wanting Arise to do more to help them grow spiritually and improve in their academic work. Hopefully next year we will be able to construct on ICT area with a few computers to help our young people become computer literate, think of new career possibilities and enjoy learning as they acquire computer skills.

FARMING AND DISCIPLESHIP



Last term was really positive for all the guardians who came to Friday Farming. They continued to plant a variety of vegetables in a much larger portion than last year and were able to take home something every week. They worked hard to do extra watering and applying the mulch so the soil did not dry out during the dry season. We had so many cabbages that had grown well, the guardians decided that we should sell some and buy more seed and fertilizer to plant more vegetables. It has been wonderful to see both the young and the older guardians working alongside each other and it is very challenging when you see them working hard planting and weeding in the hot sun after walking an hour to get to our field and then going on to their own field.

TESTIMONY TIME

You may be aware that every year we run a seed and fertilizer appeal where we raise money to help our most vulnerable families with buying seed and fertilizer for the planting. As is happening all around the world, prices of everything in Zambia have been on the increase and many families have been finding the cost of seed and fertilizer too expensive to buy this year. We explained as always that we are unable to help every family but that we are able to help a few. They decided to approach the staff and ask if was possible for them to share the bags of seed and fertilizer that we were giving them. We explained that if they wanted to plant less and share with another family so that they both had some we were happy for that. They were overjoyed that Arise would be helping more families. So this year we have been able to double the number of families that we are helping, due to the guardians sacrificial love for each other and willingness to collaborate.

Prayer Points

- 1. Praise the Lord we have been able to support many families with seed and fertilizer this year, please pray we continue to have good rainfall and the crops grown well.
- 2. Please pray for our guardians that they continue to put God first and realise the value of education more and more.
- Pray for our children, especially the new ones joining Arise this year, that they will come to know Jesus as their saviour and see the progress they are making at school.
- 4. Please pray for the leadership team as they seek to appoint a coordinator for daily operations at Arise.
