It was very difficult to train over the past 4 months as we were unsure of the government rules regarding team sports and the intense rain caused the pitch to be water logged. Finally at the end of term 1 we were able to begin football training again much to the boys delight.

They have all been putting in their best effort and hoping to be picked to play in the team's first match after a very long break. Although the team has not won many games, their ball skills have been noticed as well as their confidence. Most of the opposing teams are older than them but they don't let that phase them. All of them want the opportunity to play – even if it is just for 10 minutes on the pitch.

Yet again, our older pupils continue to delight us with their enthusiasm for studying. We have decided to encourage them for their efforts beginning this year and hopefully motivate those who have not attended all the study sessions to come more regularly. We decided for the first term, 100% attendance awards would be dictionaries. It was a big surprise to all the young people when the awards were announced and it was clear that everyone wanted to have their own dictionary.

Following the pupils requests for more time to study, we will open up the teaching room from term 2 on two afternoons a week as a study space. If the pupils want somewhere quiet to study or do homework, they will now find a safe and conducive space in the Arise block.

VISITS

It is always a great joy and challenge when we go on visits. We are delighted to see how our families are finding ways to sustain themselves and always looking for ways to improve their situation. However we are also challenged by what the best strategy is to support each family. Miriam is a wonderful guardian who needed to move house earlier this year as she was living with her mother and the wider family. Most rents were too high however she found a small house with some land behind and began to plant beans. As a result of her hard work she now has food and some income. At the moment we are encouraging her for her hard work and suggesting other crops that could be planted there.

We continue making visits during the rainy season and try to make sure we are inside when a downpour is just about to fall. The rain showers are very heavy and last for quite a while. The families are more than glad when we stay with them for an hour listening to them share about their family, reading the Bible and praying with them. Where it is possible we look at their roof and help with roof repairs as many houses are not watertight. The muddy surroundings and tall grasses not only make houses harder to find but also more dangerous places to live. Please keep praying for the safety of our families.
