A New Year

January is the beginning of the school year here in Zambia so Kapumpe has just come to the end of term 1. It has been a delight to see that the children have remembered many things from last year and continue to love coming to school.

All our pupils begin the day at 7:30am with porridge and a time to play with their friends. It is wonderful that children from various backgrounds have a place where they can meet and learn together.

Our days begin with a time of singing in class followed by phonics lessons. All the pupils enjoy learning new sounds and showing different teachers that they can read and write new words.

Now that we have reached the end of term 1, daily routines are running smoothly although in Zambia it is always good to remain flexible. There are often circumstances that arise, or changes in the weather that cause the plan for the day to be adjusted.

Assemblies

Every Monday we have an assembly to start the week. Each assembly begins with a prayer and the National Anthem. Monday assemblies include a Bible story (Term 1 has been the life of Moses), usually requiring actors and a memory verse. Often the pupils will request to be an actor in advance of the assembly. Friday assemblies are a celebration of the week. One class shares something they have been learning about and certificates are presented for excellence and progress in work, behavior and attitude.

This year we have welcomed some new pupils as well as new staff. Kapumpe began 2017 with a new head teacher, Mr Zulu. He is an experienced Zambian head teacher who is passionate about seeing both pupils and staff alike soar high and achieve their potential.

Our pre-school and Grade 2 teachers have been the voice of experience for new members of staff and the pupils have appreciated some familiar faces. Miss Chongo was the classroom assistant for Grade 1 in 2016, she is now our Grade 1 teacher.

Mrs Mwinga is a newly qualified teacher who is taking Grade 3 however she will go on maternity leave in term 2. Mr Mulenga was the Grade 4 teacher for the first half of term 1 although he is no longer at Kapumpe. We are looking forward to some new teachers joining us in term 2.



Pre-school

Term 1 is always an exciting but scary time for Pre-school children. For many of them it is their first experience of leaning in a room with a teacher. The teaching is play based which soon helps the pupils to feel at ease and realise that learning is fun.

All the pre-school children have developed amazing levels of confidence and they are becoming experts at counting.
