FAITHFUL GOD AMID FOOD SHORTAGE

What a mighty God we serve! The past few months have been a big challenge for many of our families. Like many other countries in Southern Africa at the moment, Zambia is facing a food crisis with aid having already been sent to southern provinces. On many roads the presence of soldiers has increased, checking how much mealie meal (pounded maize) is being transported. As we talk to many families we hear they are just managing to eat one meal a day; something that is difficult for many of us to imagine. This is also partly due to the significant increase in daily living costs. For those of you who have lived in Zambia you will be aware that it is possible for some items to double in price overnight.

Many of our guardians have only one or two bags of maize compared to the 16+ bags they were expecting. The poor rains we experienced last year have resulted in many need of support the country struggling for water. Some of our guardians also lacked fertilizer which is essential for a good crop.

God has blessed our small farming plot with a really good harvest this year. Our plants were healthy and our cob size was larger than most. We have many more bags of maize than some families have for the year. Guardians who have been coming to work on the field and those too elderly to farm are now able to receive to support with food provision. Thank you Lord!

MOTIVATED BY DEFEAT

The Arise team has continued to train through term and holiday, only stopping for test week. Most weeks the boys train twice, however sometimes one session is a match if the coaches have managed to arrange a game. All the local teams are bigger physically than ours but they see our boys are skilful. For us it is like facing the giants; we have not yet won but each game makes us hungry to train harder.

We are continuing to see our older pupils once a month to help with their studies and have a time of discipleship. It is clear that they need a lot more support to grasp everything on the curriculum. During the term we have seen some new guardians become regular attenders. One elderly grandmother, Josephine walks for more than 2 hours to reach the Arise plot. When we asked her if she has a small garden at home for growing some of these vegetables, she said the soil isn't good so she can't grow them at her house. Now we understand why some of these guardians value the Arise plot so much. For other guardians they live very close to neighbours and there is very little space for planting as well as any water supply being very remote. On a weekly basis these guardians water, weed and harvest the vegetables. Although we apply fertilizer and our worker John waters during the week as well, it is God who is sustaining this field and producing a bumper harvest for what we sow. Hallelujah!

TESTIMONY TIME

Bridget and her family have faced many challenges this year. They have suffered many health problems, the youngest two boys have been getting into trouble at school and the eldest two boys who have finished school cannot find work and one of her daughters has now returned to live with Bridget along with a grandson.

Bridget is constantly asking for encouragement and doing her best with what she has. Since starting the mat making last term she has made 7 mats herself while also finding piecework to buy food for the family.
